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## Title I Right to Know

### *What is "Title I"?*

The purpose of the Title I program is to provide extra instruction to students who are struggling to meet grade level expectations in reading, writing, math, science, or social studies.

### *Your Right to Know...*

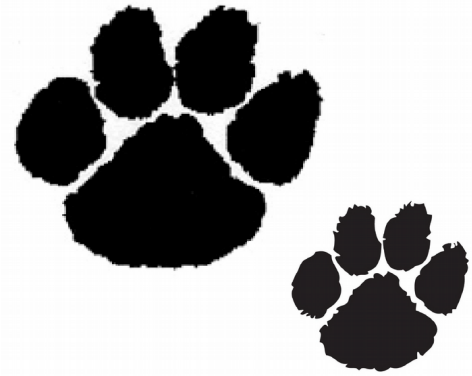
As a parent/guardian of a student at a school that receives Title I funding, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner if you ask for it. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following:

- whether your child's teacher has met Michigan qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction,
- whether your child's teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which Michigan qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived,
- the baccalaureate degree major of your child's teacher and any other graduate or degree, and
- whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.
